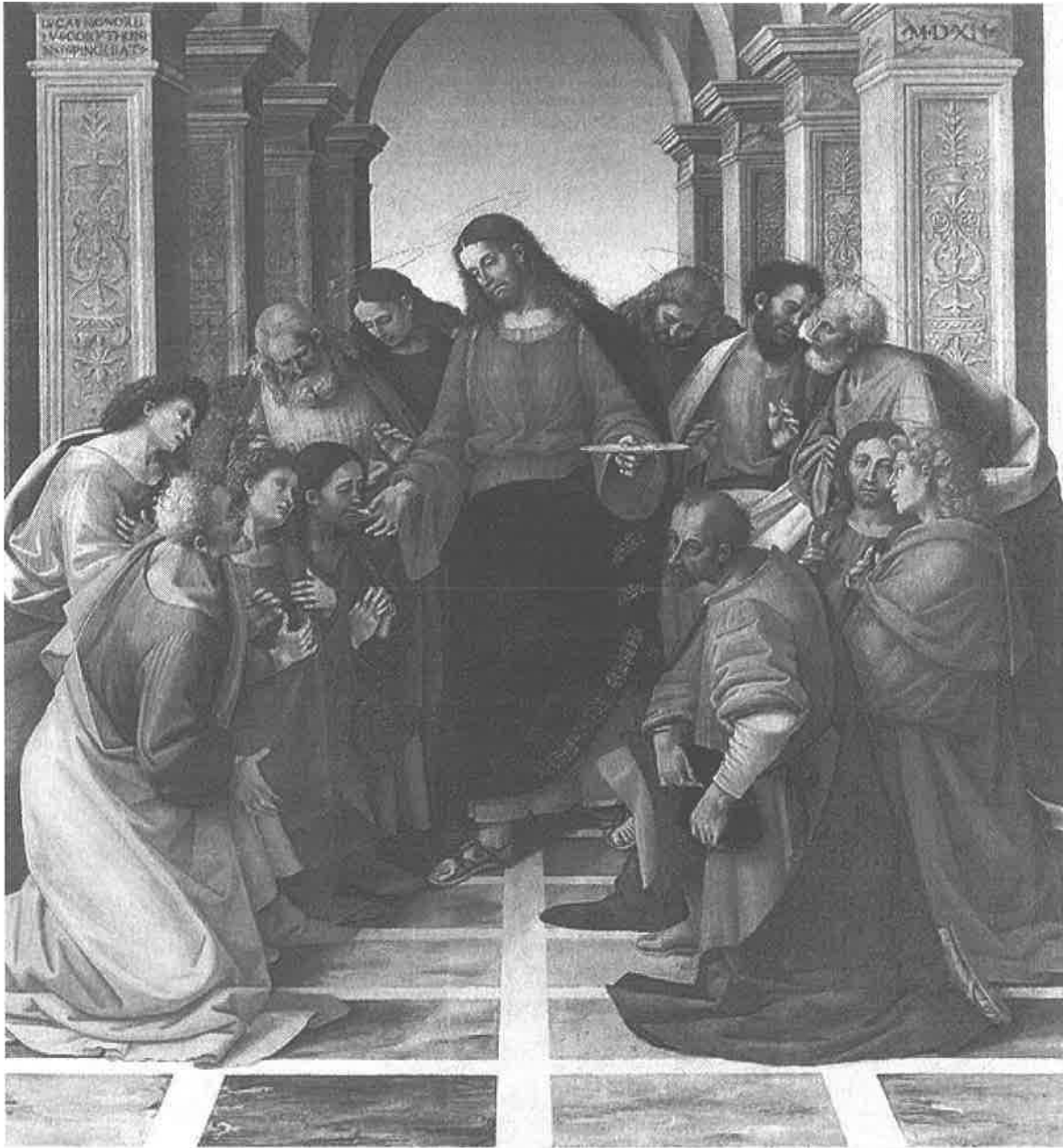


Is Jesus Christ the Son of God? Meh. Who cares?
